



PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)
- Let the clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host,
- The clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christm" and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.

PALM SUNDAY IS THE FINAL SUNDAY OF LENT...

The beginning of Holy Week, and commemorates the triumphant arrival of Christ in Jerusalem, days before He was crucified.

Palm Sunday is known as such because the faithful will often receive palm fronds which they use to participate in the reenactment of Christ's arrival in Jerusalem. In the Gospels, Jesus entered Jerusalem riding a young donkey, to the lavish praise of the townspeople who threw clothes, or possibly palms or small branches, in front of Him as a sign of homage. This was a customary practice for people of great respect.

Palm branches are widely recognized symbols of peace and victory, hence their preferred use on Palm Sunday.

The use of a donkey instead of a horse is highly symbolic, representing the humble arrival of someone in peace, as opposed to arriving on a steed in war.

A week later, Christ would rise from the dead on the first Easter.


During Palm Sunday Mass, palms are distributed to parishioners who carry them in a ritual procession into church. The palms are blessed and many people will fashion them into small crosses or other items of personal devotion. These may be returned to the church, or kept for the year.

Because the palms are blessed, they may not be discarded as trash. Instead, they are appropriately gathered at the church and incinerated to create the ashes that will be used in the follow year's Ash Wednesday observance.

The colors of the Mass on Palm Sunday are red and white, symbolizing the redemption in blood that Christ paid for the world.

AROUND THE DIOCESE



A TRAFFIC STOPPING GOOD FRIDAY SERVICE AT HIGH STREET AND 161.

An unforgettable Good Friday Service takes place every year at noon on the four corners of High Street and 161 in Worthington. If you haven't yet participated in this ecumenical service of all the Christian Churches in Worthington (including St. Michael), you are missing something to behold. Imagine a group of 200-400 Christians of all ages and denominations walking behind a Crucifix, from corner to corner at NOON on High Street and 161, STOPPING

TRAFFIC 5 TIMES, with police protection (2 times across High Street, 2 times across 161, and ONE TIME DIAGONALLY ACROSS HIGH STREET AND 161) to commemorate Jesus' Crucifixion and death on Good Friday. The service, which occurs at seven prayer stations at various locations on the four corners of the Worthington Green, consists of hymns (with musical accompaniment by the Salvation Army Band), and readings from the Passion according to John (along with other appropriate readings and prayers), led by clergy from each of the participating churches. The service starts at Worthington Presbyterian Church on the Northwest corner of High Street and 161, and ends in the graveyard behind St. John's Episcopal Church on the Southeast corner. (If it rains, the service is held in Worthington Presbyterian Church.) It lasts about an hour. If you don't get emotional each time the procession crosses High Street or 161 against Police-Stopped traffic, just wait until you cross diagonally across High Street and 161 to process to the last station at St. John, all in the name of our crucified Jesus. It's a Good Friday experience you'll never forget.


