

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2017 The Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parishioners of St. Michael Parish,

We have all been watching with anxious concern for the people whose lives have



been devastated by Hurricane Harvey. While the recovery efforts are just beginning, it is expected that this will take years. Many government and social aid agencies, including Catholic Charities USA, are working tirelessly to bring comfort and relief to millions of people. In a letter sent to the clergy of the Diocese of Columbus, Deacon Thomas Berg, Chancellor, stated:

In times of tragedy, we are reminded that the Church is always a primary source of healing and peace. However, as is so often the case, the Church itself in these regions is both a source of help and aid as well as a victim. Many of the Churches will be damaged and their resources depleted, which makes it more difficult to fulfill the mission of providing aid, comfort, and the pastoral outreach needed (*Letter August 29, 2017*).

It is with this in mind that the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has requested that a special collection be taken up at the direction of each Diocesan Bishop for those affected by this disaster. The funds raised "will be used to support efforts of Catholic Charities USA and other Catholic agencies as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in Texas and other affected parts of the Gulf Coast region" (*Ibid*).

While it is suggested to take up the collection the weekend of September 9-10, Pastors have been given discretion to choose another suitable weekend. I am therefore asking that the collection be taken up the weekend of September 16-17. This collection will take place after Communion and will be handled in the usual manner as directed by the Diocese. If you wish to make a donation by check through this collection, please make your check out to St. Michael Parish and write "Hurricane Harvey Relief" on the memo line and place it in the second collection. In order to ensure that this collection remains separate from the regular collection, please do not place donations for this in the regular collection basket. Thank you all in advance for your generosity!

Thanks, also to everyone who supported the Parish Festival on Labor Day Weekend. While the weather was not ideal on Friday and Saturday, the turnout was still pretty good, considering. Sunday, of course, was perfect and everyone seemed to enjoy themselves! God bless you all! Can't wait for next year! (Well, actually I am sure we can as we are all tired, but you know what I mean!) ©

(*The Parish Office does not have any information regarding PSR*, costs, forms, your child's records, start date – that can all be found on the parish website.)
- The delay is not expected to affect the dates for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion or Confirmation. Your patience is greatly appreciated as we work through this and know that we will keep you updated as more information becomes available.

PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:



- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher, they'll be happy to assist you.)
- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.
