

# PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

• Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy (if you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an usher, they'll be happy to assist you).



- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten Host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts) see photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten Host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.







## **ROE REMEMBRANCE**

Bishop Campbell will celebrate Mass on Monday, January 23rd, at 10:30 a.m., at St Joseph's Cathedral. Those who wish may then process to the Ohio Statehouse for the Greater Columbus Right to Life Annual Roe Remembrance Event from noon until 1:00 p.m. The event will be held indoors in the Atrium. Note that sticks, signs, and weapons are not permitted. Allow a little extra time, as Statehouse security measures have increased in the past few years.



# WHY DO WE BURN INCENSE DURING MASS?

In the Old Testament God commanded His people to burn incense (Exodus 30:7, 40:27). Incense is a *sacramental* used to venerate, bless, and sanctify. Its smoke conveys a sense of mystery and awe. It is a reminder of the sweet-smelling presence of our Lord. Its use adds a feeling of solemnity to the Mass. The visual imagery of the smoke and

the smell reinforce the transcendence of the Mass linking Heaven with Earth, allowing us to enter into the presence of God. The smoke symbolizes the burning zeal of faith that should consume all Christians, while the fragrance symbolizes Christian virtue. Incensing may also be viewed in the context of a "burnt offering" given to God. In the Old Testament, animal offerings were partially or wholly consumed by fire. In essence, to burn something was to give it to God. Incense and the smoke of burning incense have been offered as gifts to God and to others since ancient times. In a more practical, visual sense as the fragrant smoke ascends, it also symbolizes our prayers rising to heaven.
