



HURRICANE HARVEY COLLECTION TODAY – SEPTEMBER 16 & 17



Over the past few weeks, we have been witnessing the devastation caused in Texas and other parts of the Gulf Coast region caused by Hurricane Harvey. The recovery is

expected to take years, and many government and social aid agencies, including Catholic Charities USA, are already working tirelessly to bring comfort and relief to the millions of people affected by this disaster.

With this in mind, the **United States Conference of Catholic Bishops** has requested, and Bishop Campbell has approved, a special collection from the Diocese of Columbus for those affected by Hurricane Harvey. These funds will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA and other Catholic agencies as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in Texas and other affected parts of the Gulf Coast region.

This collection will be taken up here at St. Michael, this weekend – September 16/17, 2017, after our regular collection.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION - PSR UPDATE

- As many families are aware, PSR had *originally* been scheduled to start Sunday, September 10th.
- Due to asbestos abatement construction at the school, the start date for school has been delayed, which has then <u>delayed the start of PSR</u>. The deadline has been extended, so please continue to send in your PSR Registration forms.



- A new start date for PSR has not yet been decided, but it is hoped to be the first of October.
- Once a new start date has been decided, it will be announced in several different ways via the church website at <u>www.saintmichael-cd.org</u> (then click <u>Evangelization</u>, then click <u>Parish School of Religion</u>, then click around on the different links to find the information you seek).
- The webpage will always have the most up-to-date information available.
- Announcements will also be made via the church bulletin and the digital information screen located in Marian Hall.
- They will be able to send updates via email to families once PSR staff are able to access the computers with their database information on it.
- If you have any questions about the **costs, the forms, the calendar** <u>please visit the website as all of that information is found</u> <u>there</u>.
- For information specific to your family or your registration, please email Religious Education Department at <u>religioused@</u> <u>saintmichael-cd.org</u>, but note that there may be a significant delay for a response as staffing is very limited and does not currently have access to the information you may be inquiring about. (*The Parish Office does not have any information regarding PSR*, costs, forms, your child's records, start date – that can all be found on the parish website.)
- The delay is not expected to affect the dates for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion or Confirmation. Your patience is greatly appreciated as we work through this and know that we will keep you updated as more information becomes available.

AROUND THE PARISH

PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)
- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the Minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the host up and say, "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the host and follow the Communion line as usual.

How do I get started?

By attending RCIA – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. RCIA is a preparatory time, which someone who prompted by the Spirit, feels called to become Catholic, receives teachings and instructions on the Catholic Faith. It is fun and informative at the same time. Everyone is welcome and there is absolutely no obligation to join the Church.

What's it like?

Set up in an informal group format, we will cover a variety of topics, areas for discussion, as well as many different speakers and teachers who provide a well-rounded introduction to the faith. It culminates by being initiated into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil Mass, with Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

When does RCIA begin?

Classes began on September 13, 2017, but it's not too late for you to join us! We meet from 7:00-9:00 p.m., in the Upper Meeting Room (just follow the signs), where we are just getting to know each other in preparation for those who are interested in becoming Catholic, and for those have been baptized and are looking to receive instructions on initiation and bring them into full communion with the Church.
