PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)
- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN BECOMING CATHOLIC? OR DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE WHO IS?

Being Catholic is a universal call to holiness. Holiness is growing close to God through your faith which you believe and live in your daily life. Catholics are able to actively participate in the sacramental life of the Church. A Church which was founded by Jesus Christ, and 2000 years later, remains guided by the Holy Spirit. It is a Church built on Scripture and Tradition.

How do I get started? By attending RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults. RCIA is a preparatory time, which someone who prompted by the Spirit, feels called to become Catholic, receives teachings and instructions on the Catholic Faith. It is fun and informative at the same time. Everyone is welcome and there is absolutely no obligation to join the Church.

What's it like? Set up in an informal group format, we will cover a variety of topics, areas for discussion, as well as many different speakers and teachers who provide a well-rounded introduction to the faith. It culminates by being initiated into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil Mass, with Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation

When does RCIA begin? Starting Wednesday, September 13th, 2017-April 2018, from 7:00-9:00 p.m., we will begin classes in preparation for those who are interested in becoming Catholic, and for those have been baptized and are looking to receive instructions on initiation and bring them into Full Communion with the Church.



2017 ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME RECIPIENTS RECOGNITION



PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION AT SAINT MICHAEL

ADORATION SCHEDULE:

The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. The faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.



REGISTRATION (You must register to obtain the access code):

- 1. Sign up online on the parish website at https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/.
- 2. Paper forms are still available in the chapel for those without Internet access. Fill one out and slip it under the parish window at anytime.

The Adoration Chapel is open to all (no code needed) during office hours, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday.

ADORERS NEEDED - A second Adorer is needed on many hours.
