



PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the clergy (if you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher and they'll be happy to assist you).
- Let the clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts) see photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.

ATTENTION, ALL EMHCS AND LECTORS, PLUS INTERESTED

St. Michael Parishioners interested in serving your parish as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) or a Lector (or both): If you have never served in these ministries or have previously served at another parish and want to be certified at St. Michael, there will be a Training Session for both ministries Thursday, December 1st, at 7:00 p.m. This training is also for CURRENT Lectors and CURRENT Extraordinary Ministers.

What does an EMHC do? They help the priest with distribution of Holy Communion on Sunday Masses and Holy Days/Holidays. They also have the opportunity, if they choose, to bring Holy Communion to the homebound or nursing homes. Serving as a Eucharistic Minister is a privilege and a sacred way to serve the Lord in the blessed sacrament and the St. Michael Community.

What does a Lector do? A Lector is the person who proclaims the first or second reading at Mass. A Lector should be able to proclaim the readings in a clear, well-modulated manner that expresses the dignity of Scripture.

Ministers (EMHC and Lector) should be:

- A fully-initiated Catholic, having celebrated the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation.
- A Catholic in Good Standing under no Canonical penalty, if married, the marriage recognized by the Church.
- A registered and active member of St. Michael Church.
- Available to serve at least one Mass per month.
- Attend scheduled training and ongoing formation opportunities.

THIS TRAINING IS ALSO THE RECERTIFICATION FOR CURRENT LECTORS AND EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS, SO PLEASE PLAN TO ATTEND.
