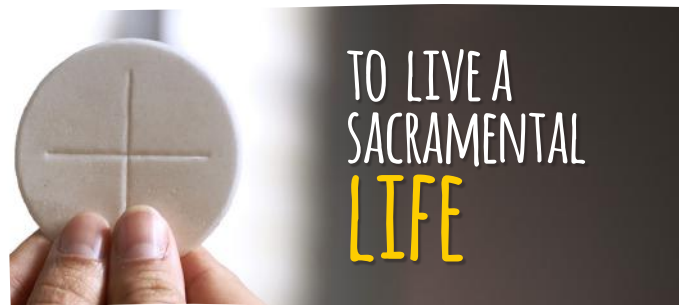

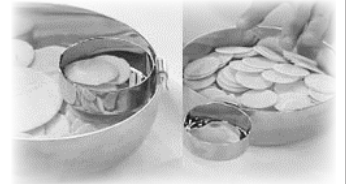

PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:



- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the clergy (if you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher and they'll be happy to assist you).
- Let the clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts) – see photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.

ANYONE INTERESTED IN SERVING AS LECTOR OR EMHC

St. Michael Parishioners interested in serving your parish as an **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC)** or a **Lector** (or both) – There will be training on Thursday, December 1st, at 7:00 p.m., in the church. If you have never served in these ministries or have previously served at another parish and want to serve at St. Michael, you will be required to attend this training.

This training is ALSO for CURRENT Lectors and CURRENT Extraordinary Ministers

What does an EMHC do? They help the priest with distribution of Holy Communion on Sunday Masses and Holy Days/Holidays. They also have the opportunity, if they choose, to bring Holy Communion to the homebound or nursing homes. Serving as a Eucharistic Minister is a privilege and a sacred way to serve the Lord in the blessed sacrament and the St. Michael community.

What does a Lector do? A Lector is the person who proclaims the first or second reading at Mass. A Lector should be able to proclaim the readings in a clear, well-modulated manner that expresses the dignity of Scripture.

Ministers (EMHC and Lector) should be:

- A fully Initiated Catholic, having celebrated the Sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist and Confirmation.
- Catholic in Good Standing under no Canonical penalty (if married, the marriage recognized by the Church).
- A registered and active member of St. Michael Church.
- Available to serve at least one Mass per month.
- Attend scheduled training and ongoing formation opportunities.

THIS TRAINING IS ALSO FOR CURRENT LECTORS AND EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS TO BE RECERTIFIED, SO PLEASE PLAN TO ATTEND.

We invite you to visit their display tables and view some of the finest handcrafts available from the Holy Land. This Family strives to bring these fine carvings to our church.

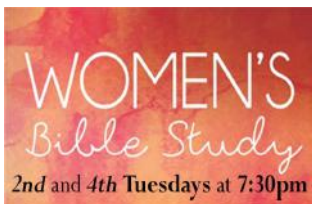

Bimonthly Healing Mass on November 21, at Saint Joseph Cathedral: A Mass of Healing and Healing Service will be celebrated on Monday, November 21, 6:30 p.m., at Saint Joseph Cathedral, 212 East Broad Street, Columbus. Following the Mass, a Service of Healing will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of Relic of the True Cross of Christ, followed by an opportunity for each person to speak individually with a priest and receive a prayer of healing for what they seek. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Service of Healing will close with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's

healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities, in addition to those seeking emotional and spiritual healing. All caregivers, family members, and members of the medical community are invited, as well. Parking is available at the rear of the Cathedral accessible off East Gay Street.
