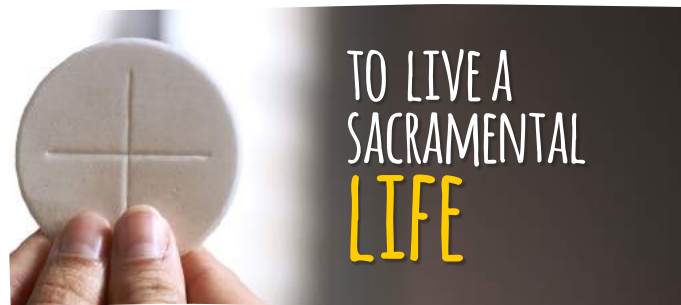

AROUND THE PARISH

PARISHIONERS NEEDING A LOW-GLUTEN HOST SHOULD FOLLOW THE FOLLOWING STEPS:

- Stop in the Sacristy 10-15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you’re not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They’ll be happy to assist you.)
- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you will be needing a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the “Joseph Side.”
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will have the Host in a special pyx (a small container) attached to the main ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the Minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say “The Body of Christ,” and then will place it in your palm once you respond “Amen.” Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line, as usual.

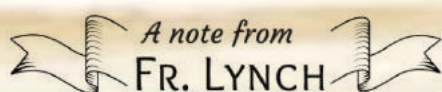

RESPECT LIFE

372 – Man and woman were made “for each other” – not that God left them half-made and incomplete: He created them to be a communion of persons, in which each can be “helpmate” to the other, for they are equal as persons (“bone of my bones...”), and complementary as masculine and feminine. In marriage God unites them in such a way that, by forming “one flesh,” **245** – they can transmit human life: “Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth.” **246** – By transmitting human life to their descendants, man and woman as spouses and parents cooperate in a unique way in the Creator’s work. **247**

2202 – A man and a woman united in marriage, together with their children, form a family. This institution is prior to any recognition by public authority, which has an obligation to recognize it. It should be considered the normal reference point by which the different forms of family relationship are to be evaluated.

2203 – In creating man and woman, God instituted the human family and endowed it with its fundamental constitution. Its members are persons equal in dignity. For the common good of its members and of society, the family necessarily has manifold responsibilities, rights, and duties.

BIMONTHLY MASS OF HEALING, JANUARY 15, 6:30 P.M., SAINT JOSEPH CATHEDRAL

Following the Mass of Healing, a Healing Service will take place beginning with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of Relics of the True Cross. Each person will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing; the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with physical illness and infirmities (e.g., cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those who seek emotional and spiritual healing. WHAT IS THE EPIPHANY?

The Epiphany is celebrated each **January 6**, and is a day dedicated to the birth of Christ, which includes a nod toward the three Kings who came to visit Him. The word "epiphany" means "an appearance or manifestation, especially of a deity." Appearance is correct, as Christ revealed himself in the form of a newborn babe to the Three Wise Men, who traveled from their countries to pay tribute to the Son of God!

It is also a reference to the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist. The six Sundays following The Epiphany are known as the time of manifestation. The Gospel of Matthew describes three Wise Men, named Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar, who were told of Christ's birth and set off, following the Star of Bethlehem, to meet the baby Jesus. Each King brought with Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh to represent Jesus' elevated position, divine birth and mortality respectively. Historically, Christmas was celebrated each day from Christmas Eve to the Epiphany, with January 6 being as large a celebration as December 25. Though Protestant Churches celebrate a season of Epiphany, from January 6 to Ash Wednesday, the Catholic Church observes Epiphany as a single day, with some in America celebrating the Epiphany Feast on the Sunday following January 6. On the Feast of the Epiphany, the family gathers to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, our joys and sorrows. A traditional way of doing this is to use chalk to write above

the home's entrance. It can also be written somewhere inside the home. **+20 C M B 17+**

The letters C, M, B have two meanings:

- They are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar.
- They also abbreviate the Latin words *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." You may have noticed these markings over the doors leading into the church here at St. Michael.

The faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.
The Chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.).
For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code
to the front door and the Chapel door.
This is for the safety of the Adorers in the Chapel.

HOW DO I REGISTER?

1. Sign up online on the parish website at <https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/>.
This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code.
This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the Chapel closings due to weather, holy days, etc., and when the code changes periodically.
2. Paper forms are still available in the Chapel for those without Internet access.

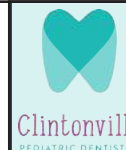
