



SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 18, 2018 The First Sunday of Lent

Beginning on March 3rd at the Saturday evening Mass, we will begin our Lenten Parish Mission. This year, we will have with us Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap. (Information on him is elsewhere in the bulletin). The Mission is entitled Saints of the Church: Models and Methods for the New Evangelization, Overcoming Sin and Division. Fr. Joseph will preach at all the Sunday Masses (Saturday evening Vigil included). On Monday Night, he will give a presentation on "The Four Last Things" in the context of the life of Blessed Solanus Casey. On Tuesday evening, he will speak on the "Seven Deadly Sins" in the context of the Story of St. Padre Pio. There will also be a Penance Service that evening. On Wednesday evening, Father will speak on the Eucharist and the Blessed Mother. In addition to Tuesday evening confessions with a variety of priests, Fr. Joseph will also be available on Monday and Wednesday for the Sacrament of Reconciliation as well. Please pray for the renewal of the Parish as we begin this Parish Mission and set a course for the mission of being disciples of Jesus Christ.

Also, please be advised that with the recent harsh weather, some dripping water was seen coming from the church ceiling. The roofs were recently inspected. While there were some small repairs needed to the roof over Marian Hall, it was determined that the roof of the Church is in fine shape. The water that has been dripping down is a result of condensation which builds up on the underside of the copper roof due to the severe cold air outside and the warm moist air inside. The condensation is then released in the church in the form of droplets of water. No repairs to the roof are needed.

AROUND THE PARISH

DO YOU NEED A LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION?

Stop in the Sacristy at least 15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)



- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you need a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- Look for Clergy or Extraordinary Minister who has a pyx (small cup) attached to their ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line, as usual.



meat (an average of \$3.00 per person per meal) into your CRS Rice Bowl to feed our brothers and sisters in need around the world. This week's recipe is from Nicaragua, in honor of Cesia and families like hers.

SOPA DE QUESO (CHEESE SOUP)

Makes 6 servings

Ingredients:

Water

1 large onion, sliced

2 green peppers, sliced

2 red tomatoes, sliced

3 cloves garlic, smashed

1 bunch mint

4 c whole milk

2 ½ c Maseca

Pinch of salt

3 c queso fresco or farmer's cheese, grated

1 ½ T achiote paste

1 T fair trade olive oil

1 c vegetable oil

In a large pot, boil 4 cups water. Add onion, pepper, tomatoes, garlic and mint. Simmer until cooked. Meanwhile, combine Maseca and 2 cups water in a mixing bowl. Knead to form a dough. Mix 1 T olive oil into achiote paste. Mix cheese, salt and achiote paste into dough. Take 1 cup of dough and place in separate bowl; stir in ½ cup water. Set aside the rest of the dough to make fritters. In a separate pot, bring milk to a boil. Remove mint and discard half of the vegetables from the first pot. Then, add the dough-and-water mixture and boiled milk to the pot, and salt to taste. Stir and turn off heat. To make the fritters, form the remaining

To make the fritters, form the remaining dough into palm-sized circles. Fry in oil until crispy and brown. Garnish the soup with mint, and serve with rice and fritters.



Fr. Joseph was born in Columbus, OH, in 1967, and was raised in Canton, OH. He entered Borromeo College Seminary in 1986 where he earned his Bachelor's Degree in Behavioral Sciences in 1989. In 1990, he professed his first vows as a Capuchin Franciscan friar. Making his Perpetual vows in 1993, he went on to earn his Master's Degree in Theology at the Washington Theological Union in 1995 and was ordained to the priesthood in 1997 in Pittsburgh, PA, by Donald Cardinal Wuerl, now of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC.

Fr. Joseph's first assignment after ordination was on the Pacific island of Papua New Guinea where he served for four years with our friars of the Custody there. Returning to the US in 2001, he has served in various capacities as Parochial Vicar, Military and Hospital Chaplain and as Pastor.

Most recently, Fr. Joseph worked with our friars in the Custody of Puerto Rico and currently serves as a full-time Minister of the Word and Evangelization for our Capuchin Province, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious and Priests.


