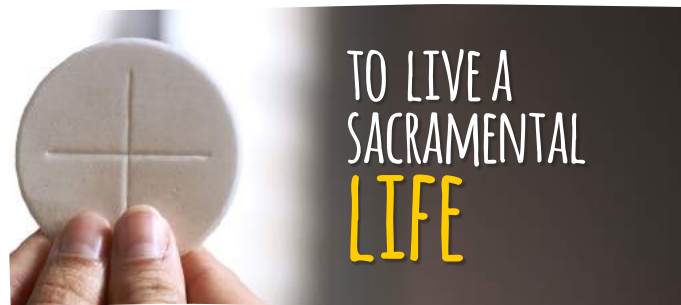

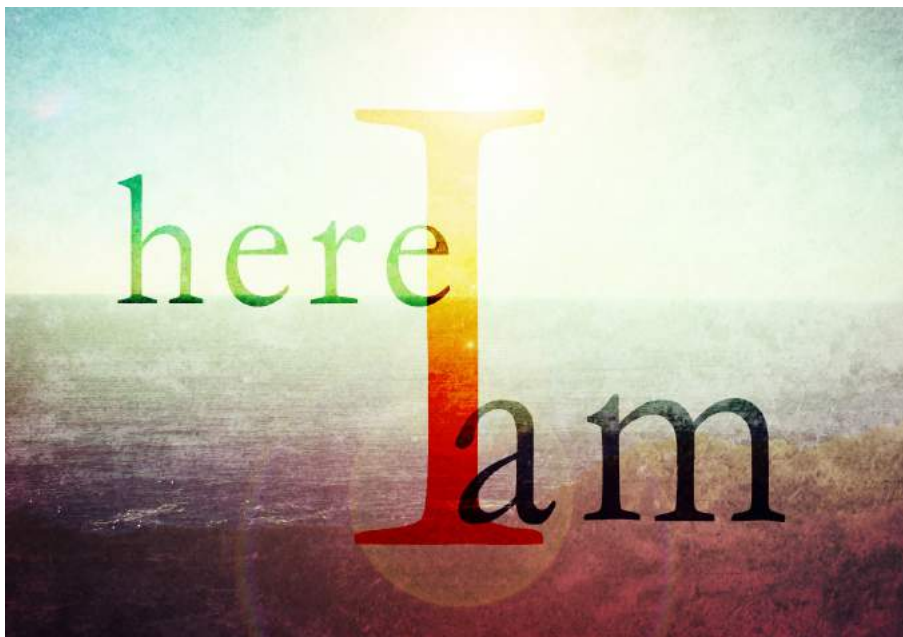

Let us know the full name of the person the Mass is for, whether they are living or deceased and give three dates (per Mass intention) you would like for us to check availability and we will assign the first one available (or the one nearest to the date you requested). Families may request up to four Sunday Masses per year. DO YOU NEED A LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION?

Stop in the Sacristy at least 15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)



- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you need a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- Look for Clergy or Extraordinary Minister who has a pyx (small cup) attached to their ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See Photo.
- When you approach the Minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line, as usual.

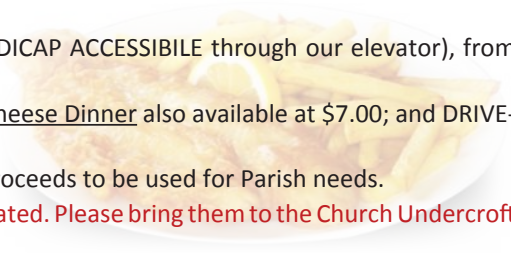
LENTEN FISH FRY

THIRD WEEK OF LENT – ENCOUNTER SAFIATA

The dry and dusty climate of Burkina Faso means farming can be difficult. It means water can be hard to come by. And it means Safiata and her family often face hunger. Even though she had two plots of land to farm, the many months each year without rain made feeding her 9 children and 16 grandchildren a real challenge.

That's why Catholic Relief Services is providing farmers like Safiata with more land to grow crops – like onions – that thrive in dry climates. And thanks to a CRS-sponsored irrigation system, she knows she'll have access to water year-round. That means her crops will grow, and she'll be able to sell some at the market. "I pay school fees thanks to selling the vegetables. The vegetables help solve the problems my family faces," Safiata says. Moreover, she can prepare for the future. Together with others, Safiata is putting a little of the income she earns from selling her crops at the market into a community savings pool. "If you face difficulties, the community will help you," she says. Those who contribute can borrow money from the fund for emergencies, school fees for their children, or to build businesses.

Fasting from meat on Fridays during Lent helps us "acquire a mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart." (CCC 2043). Fasting is meant to free us. It helps us feel our physical hunger, and in turn, our spiritual hunger for the infinite love found only in God. Gather your community, your friends or your family for a simple, meatless meal, an opportunity to eat while living in solidarity with our brothers and sisters around the world. **When you've cleaned your plate**, remember to put the money you saved by not buying meat –

an average of \$3.00 per person per meal – into your CRS Rice Bowl to feed our brothers and sisters in need around the world. This week's recipe is from Burkina Faso, in honor of Safiata and families like hers.



Recipe:

BEAN CAKES – BURKINA FASO

Makes 6-8 Bean Cakes

Ingredients:

- 1 can black-eyed peas, drained
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 2 carrots, peeled and chopped
- 1 egg, whisked
- ½ t salt
- ½ t black pepper
- 1 c flour
- ¼ c vegetable oil

Place black-eyed peas in a blender with the onion, carrots and egg. Blend to a smooth paste, and add salt and pepper. If bean mixture has too much liquid to form cakes, add flour, ¼ cup at a time to thicken until you can form into cakes. Divide into 6 to 8 portions and place in hot vegetable oil. Flatten each one into a disc using a spatula. Fry until browned (about 5-7 minutes), turning occasionally. Serve with rice.

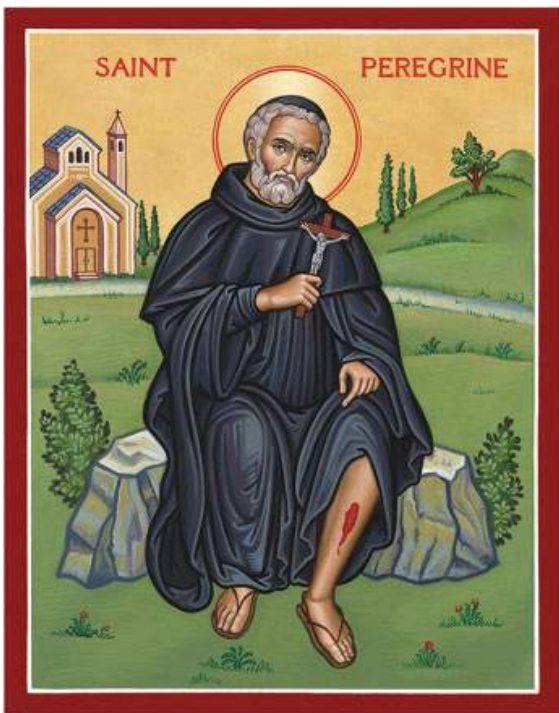

LENTEN REFLECTION FROM BISHOP CAMPBELL

Second Sunday of Lent – February 25, 2018

Today, God asks Abraham to bring his only son, Isaac, to the altar for sacrifice. Imagine placing so much trust in the Lord that you would be willing to sacrifice your own child. Abraham had no way of knowing what the Lord had planned or why the Lord was requiring him to sacrifice Isaac, yet he trusted in the Lord and prepared to give an ultimate sacrifice.

Often, the Lord calls us as He called Abraham. He asks us to bear suffering and hardships without knowing the fullness of His plan. People who suffer grave illnesses have opportunities to follow in the footsteps of trust that the Lord will reveal His greater plan and will provide for all their needs, as He did for Abraham.

ADORATION SCHEDULE:

When can I visit? The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass, or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

How do I get in? The Chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.) For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the chapel door. This is for the safety of the adorers in the Chapel

How do I register to receive an after-hours code?

1. Sign up online on the parish website at <https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/>. This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code. This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the Chapel closings due to weather, holy days, etc., and when the code changes periodically.

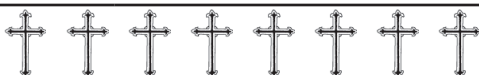
