MASS INTENTION REQUESTS – WOULD YOU LIKE TO HAVE A MASS OFFERED FOR SOMEONE?

Would you like to offer a Mass for a deceased loved one or for the Special Intention of someone special to you? It's easy – just email us at <u>office@saintmichael-cd.org</u>, and put "Mass Intentions" in the subject line. Let us know the full name of the person the Mass is for, whether they are living or deceased and give three dates (per Mass intention) that you would like for us to check the availability of and we will assign the first one available (or the one nearest to the date you requested). Families may request up to four Sunday Masses per year. The stipend for each Mass is \$10.00 payable to St. Michael Catholic Church, which you can place in any weekend offering basket in a plain envelope marked "Mass Intentions." We are scheduling from mid-April through December 2018.

DO YOU NEED A LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION?

Stop in the Sacristy at least 15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)



- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you need a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- Look for Clergy or Extraordinary Minister who has a pyx (small cup) attached to their ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the Minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line, as usual.



AROUND THE PARISH

IS HE CALLING YOU?

Are you being called to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMH) or Lector (or both?) Do you have a deep and obvious love for the Blessed Sacrament and are you committed to the Church's understanding of the Real Presence?

EMHCs and Lectors must be trained and commissioned, so if this is something you've considered, please plan to attend the next training session on **Tuesday, March 20th, from 7:45-9:00 p.m.**

To register, visit our website at <u>www.saintmichael-cd.org</u>, and click on "Spiritual Life," then selection "Lector," and fill out the form. (It will ask you if you want to register to be trained as an EMHC or Lector on the form. If you wish to be trained as both, you will need to attend two separate training sessions, which are offered every quarter.) In order to serve in this very important ministry, ministers must:

- Be a practicing Catholic (i.e., attends weekly Sunday Mass) and fully Initiated (i.e., Baptized and Confirmed in the Catholic Church).
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- If married, your marriage is recognized by the Church.

FOURTH WEEK OF LENT – ENCOUNTER ALEFA

Alefa is a mother, grandmother and farmer. She provides for her three children, three grandchildren and husband by selling her crops. If they fail during one of Malawi's rainy seasons – or in a drought – her family goes hungry. One particularly difficult year, Alefa was forced to sell some of her land to make ends meet.

She knew she had to start planting crops that could withstand Malawi's changing climate. So, she attended a CRS-sponsored seed fair, where farmers learn the best crops to plant for the upcoming year, and receive vouchers so they can choose the seeds and supplies they need. Besides rice, Alefa bought corn, cabbage and tomato seeds. This way, she can continue farming rice but also feel confident that, even if her rice fails, she will have other crops to sell.

"This harvest will provide food, shelter and education for my family," she says. In a few short months, Alefa will be growing corn and harvesting hope.

Fasting from meat on Fridays during Lent helps us "acquire a mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart." (CCC 2043). Fasting is meant to free us. It helps us feel our physical hunger, and in turn, our spiritual hunger for the infinite love found only in God. Gather your community, your friends or your family for a simple, meatless meal, an opportunity to eat while living in solidarity with our brothers and sisters around the world. **When you've cleaned your plate**, remember to put the money you saved by not buying meat (an average of \$3.00 per person per meal) into your CRS Rice Bowl to feed our brothers and sisters in need around the world. This week's recipe is from Malawi, in honor of Alefa and families like hers.

UJENI NDIWO (VEGETABLES WITH RICE) Makes 4-5 Servings

Ingredients:

- 2 T fair trade olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped 2 t curry powder
- 1 ½ T fresh ginger,
- grated

3 medium tomatoes, chopped 1 T powdered milk 5 cups of kale or spinach, thinly cut Salt, to taste

Instructions: In large pan, sauté onion in oil. Add curry powder and ginger; cook for 2 minutes. Add tomatoes. Simmer for 2 minutes, then add powdered milk. Stir in the greens, cover and simmer for 5 minutes. Serve with rice.

ADORATION CHAPEL INFORMATION

ADORATION SCHEDULE:

<u>When can I visit</u>? The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

<u>How do I get in</u>? The Chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday. 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.). For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the Chapel door. This is for the safety of the Adorers in the Chapel.

How do I register to receive an after-hours code?

- 1. Sign up online on the parish website at https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/. This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code. This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the Chapel closings, due to weather, holy days, etc., and when the code changes periodically.
- 2. Paper forms are still available in the chapel for those without Internet access. Fill one out and slip it under the parish window at any time. Questions? Email adoration@saintmichael-cd.org.

When entering the Chapel, <u>everyone</u> (scheduled Adorers, substitutes, visitors, drop-ins, and guests) are asked to sign in at the podium in the Chapel Corner. This eliminates any confusion regarding who is or is not providing continuous coverage.
