MASS INTENTION REQUESTS – WOULD YOU LIKE TO HAVE A MASS OFFERED FOR SOMEONE?



Would you like to offer a Mass for a deceased love one or for the Special Intention of someone special to you? It's easy – just email us at office@saintmichael-cd.org and put "Mass Intentions" in the subject line. Let us know the full name of the person the Mass is for, whether they are living or deceased and give three dates (per Mass intention) you would like for us to check the availability of and we will assign the first one available (or the one nearest to the date you requested).

Families may request up to four Sunday Masses per year. The stipend for each Mass is \$10.00 payable to St. Michael Catholic Church, which you can place in any weekend offering basket in a plain envelope marked "Mass Intentions." We are scheduling from mid-April through December 2018.



COMMUNION FOR THE HOMEBOUND

DO YOU NEED A LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION?

Stop in the Sacristy at least 15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the Clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an Usher. They'll be happy to assist you.)



- Let the Clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you need a low-gluten host.
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- Look for Clergy or Extraordinary Minister who has a pyx (small cup) attached to their ciborium (the container holding the Hosts). See photo.
- When you approach the Minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The Clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body of Christ," and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen." Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line, as usual.

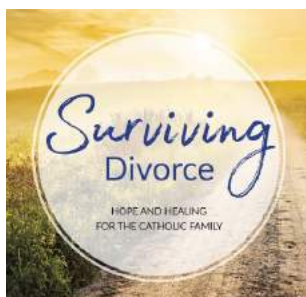

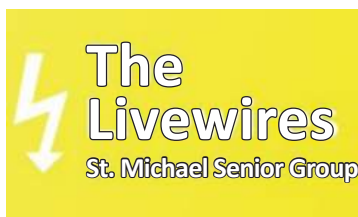

During the months of March and April, the Respect Life Committee will focus on the Church teaching in regard to contraception.

MARCH IS DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AWARENESS MONTH

Embrace. Welcome. Participate.

All persons with disabilities have gifts to contribute to the whole Church.

In 2017, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops revised the *Guidelines for the Celebration of the Sacraments with Persons with Disabilities*. The bishops remind us:

“All persons with disabilities have gifts to contribute to the whole Church. When persons with disabilities are embraced and welcomed, and invited to participate fully in all aspects of the parish community life, the Body of Christ is more complete.”

This revision is an opportunity for the Catholic community to reflect and act on the call to make the Church more complete. Every person is created in the image and likeness of God and has an inherent dignity. Each member of the Body of Christ is unique, and therefore, families and parish communities are as well. We all have gifts and challenges, come in different shapes and sizes, and have varying needs. It is through this realization we come into community, centered on Christ, to

accompany each other on our pilgrim journey.

By virtue of our Baptism, we are called by God to grow in holiness and participate in the life of the Church. Persons with disabilities desire full and meaningful participation in our shared mission to be missionary disciples. That is why it is important to ensure that they and their families experience a true sense of belonging in their parish communities.

No matter where you have been on your journey, consider today a time of renewal. Pray, learn, reflect, and act. Use your gifts and talents to embrace, welcome, and invite all persons to full participation in the life of the Church and society. Accommodations and adaptations are necessary at times to ensure that all persons can use their gifts in service to the parish community. When we work together we are more complete.

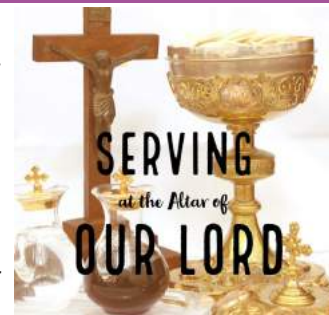
IS HE CALLING YOU?

Are you being called to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMH) or Lector (or both?) Do you have a deep and obvious love for the Blessed Sacrament and are you committed to the Church's understanding of the Real Presence?

EMHCs and Lectors must be trained and commissioned, so if this is something you've considered, please plan to attend the next training session on **Tuesday, March 20th, from 7:45 p.m.-9:00 p.m.**

To register, visit our website at www.saintmichael-cd.org, and click on "Spiritual Life," then selection "Lector," and fill out the form. *(It will ask you if you want to register to be trained as an EMHC or Lector on the form. If you wish to be trained as both, you will need to attend two separate training sessions, which are offered every quarter.)* In order to serve in this very important ministry, ministers must:

- Be a practicing Catholic (i.e., attends weekly Sunday Mass) and fully initiated (i.e., baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church).
- Be at least 16 years of age.
- If married, your marriage is recognized by the Church.
- Be available to serve at least once a month.

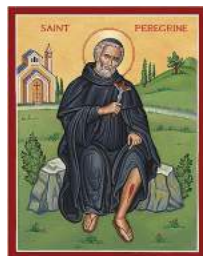

ADORATION SCHEDULE:

When can I visit?

The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass, or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

How do I get in?

The chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.) For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the Chapel door. This is for the safety of the Adorers in the Chapel

How do I register to receive an after-hours code?

1. Sign up online on the parish website at <https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/>. This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code. This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the Chapel closings, due to weather, holy days, etc., and when the code changes periodically.

2. Paper forms are still available in the chapel for those without Internet access.

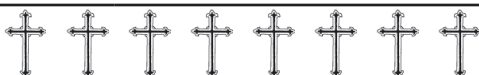
