# DO YOU NEED A LOW-GLUTEN HOST FOR COMMUNION?



Stop in the Sacristy at least 15 minutes before Mass and find a member of the clergy. (If you're not sure where the Sacristy is, please ask an usher, they'll be happy to assist you.)

- Let the clergy member (priest or deacon) know that you need a low-gluten host
- Find a seat on the right side of the church (when facing the Altar), affectionately known as the "Joseph Side."
- Follow the Communion line as you usually would.
- Look for Clergy or Extraordinary Minister who has a pyx (small cup) attached to their ciborium (the container holding the Hosts) see photo.
- When you approach the minister, just indicate by pointing to the pyx that contains the low-gluten host.
- The clergy or Extraordinary Minister will hold the Host up and say "The Body
  of Christ" and then will place it in your palm once you respond "Amen."
  Immediately consume the Host and follow the Communion line as usual.





#### **CARRY THE CROSS**

#### Men of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Columbus

Complete your Lenten fast with a truly masculine prayer and participate in:

12 Mile Hike - 14 Stations of the Cross

Holy Saturday March 31, 2018, Clear Creek Metro Park

Schedule: 7:00-7:30 a.m. arrival

7:45-8:00 a.m. Morning Prayer

8:00 a.m. - Hike begins with reading of the first station of the cross

3:00 p.m. - Final prayer

"Carry the Cross" is a 12-mile Stations of the Cross hike sponsored by Wilderness Outreach for men, fathers, and sons. A cross constructed of 3"X6" timber, approximately 10' long with a 7' cross beam is carried by the men on the journey with the Stations of the Cross prayed every mile or so. Men should bring a day pack with 2-3 liters of water, snacks, and rain gear if appropriate. During the hike, silent meditation on our Lord's passion is encouraged. Praying the Rosary and other communal and traditional prayers are also encouraged.

Last year, a total of 138 laymen, fathers, and sons participated. St. Patrick's, Columbus, won the honor of the most men. In past years, St. Mary of the Assumption, Lancaster, and St. Matthew, Gahanna, have won that honor. Each year, the parish with the most men has an engraved brass plate placed on the replica cross. Partial participation is possible.

This is a good way for fathers and sons and parish men's groups to engage and bond with one another in a masculine, spiritual, and physical challenge.

The starting location will be in the parking lot and shelter house at the Barneby Hambleton area at the western end of the park.

### **ADORATION CHAPEL INFORMATION**

#### **ADORATION SCHEDULE:**

When can I visit? The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

How do I get in? The chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.). For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the chapel door. This is for the safety of the adorers in the chapel.

#### How do I register to receive an after-hours code?

- 1. Sign up online on the parish website at https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/. This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code. This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the chapel closings due to weather, holy days, etc. and when the code changes periodically.
- 2. Paper forms are still available in the chapel for those without internet access. Fill one out and slip it under the parish window at any time. Questions? adoration@saintmichael-cd.org.

When entering the chapel, everyone (scheduled adorers, substitutes, visitors, drop-ins, and guests) are asked to sign in at the podium in the chapel corner. This eliminates any confusion regarding who is or is not providing continuous coverage.


