



### ADORATION CHAPEL-IMPORTANT ALL-ADORER MEETINGS

Thank you for all of those who have been participating in Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Michael Parish. This devotion, encouraged by Holy Mother Church, has been a great blessing for many who have committed themselves to prayer in the presence of our Lord. Having said this; however, we must also recognize that there are some areas of concern that really need to be remedied if we want to continue this devotion at St. Michael Parish.

The most pressing concern is that, according to established norms by the Church, there must be at least two people present for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament during Exposition. Unfortunately, this is not always the case. If we cannot correct this, then adjustments will have to be made by reducing the hours offered for Adoration.

To assist with this goal, we are implementing, on a trial basis, a new software scheduling package ("We Adore Him" by "On Fire Media"). This tool enables adorers to easily commit to a regular hour, request a sub, or fill an hour on a one-time basis.

Also, all registered Adorers must plan on attending one of two meetings scheduled in Marian Hall: Monday, October 15, at 7:00 p.m. or Wednesday, October 17 at 9:00 a.m.

Anyone interested in becoming an Adorer is also welcome and encouraged to attend. At these meetings, we will be communicating requirements, providing training/materials on the scheduling package, and announcing bench-marking goals and deadlines for filling gaps/reducing hours. 

### **ADORATION SCHEDULE:**

When can I visit? The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

**How do l get in**? The Chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.). For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the Chapel door. This is for the safety of the Adorers in the Chapel.

#### How do I register to receive an after-hours code?

- 1. Sign up online on the parish website at <a href="https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/">https://www.saintmichael-cd.org/spiritual-life/eucharistic-adoration/</a>. This is the quickest and most efficient way of registering and obtaining the access code. This will also allow you to keep updated via email on news about the chapel closings due to weather, holy days, etc., and when the code changes periodically.
- 2. Paper forms are still available in the Chapel for those without Internet access. Fill one out and slip it under the parish window at any time. Questions? Email adoration@saintmichael-cd.org.

When entering the Chapel, <u>everyone</u> (scheduled Adorers, substitutes, visitors, drop-ins, and guests) are asked to sign in at the podium in the chapel corner. This eliminates any confusion regarding who is or is not providing continuous coverage.
