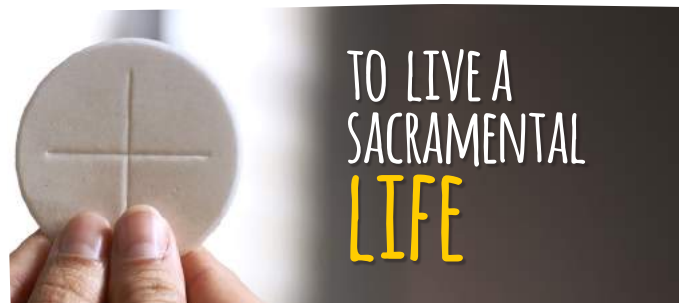

Dear Parishioners,

With the devastation caused by recent hurricanes, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked that all parishes take up a special collection for these and other long-term needs “in anticipation of more disasters awaiting us this year.” Funds will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA “as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in the form of water, food, shelter, and medical care, as well as to their long-term efforts to restore communities after widespread destruction.” Parishes in the Diocese of Columbus have been asked to take up this collection at the beginning of November. 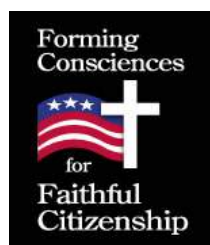
**2202** – A man and a woman united in marriage, together with their children, form a family. This institution is prior to any recognition by public authority, which has an obligation to recognize it. It should be considered the normal reference point by which the different forms of family relationship are to be evaluated.

**2203** – In creating man and woman, God instituted the human family and endowed it with its fundamental constitution. Its members are persons equal in dignity. For the common good of its members and of society, the family necessarily has manifold responsibilities, rights, and duties.

## Letter from the Pastor



October 15, 2018

Dear Members of St. Michael Parish and School,

I want to write to you about recent concerns that have affected all of us as members of the Catholic Church.

This past summer, a report was given from a Grand Jury investigation in Pennsylvania that has created deep concerns regarding the Catholic Church's handling of cases of sexual abuse of minors by clergy over the last several decades. The report is quite "gut wrenching" to say the least. This, coupled with the accusations against former Cardinal Theodore McCarrick, has angered everyone, laity and clergy alike, myself and my brother priests included. There is present a profound sense of discouragement and even despair among the faithful.

On Sunday, August 19th, I spoke to the current crisis in the Church in my homilies. Also, on the weekend of September 8th-9th, Deacon Bill Demidovich gave a homily on the same subject. You may find these and other relevant articles by following the several links on the "Safe Environment" page of our parish website.

Included in this is a link to an interview with Bishop Campbell on St. Gabriel Radio AM 820. In this interview, Bishop Campbell outlines how the Church in Columbus has responded to this crisis and how we continue to implement the "Dallas Charter" established by the U.S. Bishops in 2002. He also outlines the process of complaints, should they arise. If you have not already done so, I would suggest that you listen to this interview as it does address many of the concerns that are expressed by all of us. On September 26th, the Diocese of Columbus announced that it "intends to make public information with respect to clergy, whether living or deceased, against whom such claims have been made and hopes to make this information public within the next few months."

Please note that while I think it is important that concerns of this matter should be spoken about, I do not, however, foresee the need to do so on a continual basis at Masses, especially in presence of young children. Also, while we keep in mind the legitimate concerns raised in the context of these developments regarding accountability and transparency, I also believe it is important that we not lose sight of the overarching problem of child sexual abuse and not limit our efforts in creating safe environments for children in our parishes and schools. As we have learned, child sexual abuse is a broader issue which is not limited to one particular set of people.

At St. Michael Parish, like all parishes in the Diocese of Columbus, we are required and willingly comply with following procedures and protocols given for the hiring of all employees, as well as accepting adult volunteers with minor age children in any program in the parish and school. In addition, each year the Diocese conducts an audit for parishes and schools to make sure that the policies are being met. Our recent audit confirms that we are in compliance with the policies established in the "Dallas Charter."

To further assist with this, in February of 2016 I created a new position at St. Michael Parish, the Safe Environment Coordinator (SEC), which services parish organizations, as well as St. Michael School. This position has proven to be very valuable to help us in ensuring that all employees and volunteers are adhering to the policies that have been established.

We have taken other initiatives to increase safety measures over the last few years, such as restricting access points to unauthorized visitors in places where children are present in the parish buildings. But, I also envision more that can and should be done, such as adding more key card access points to areas of the parish buildings when and where children are gathered, as well as improving our video surveillance systems parish wide. I ask anyone who would like to assist in supporting these endeavors through prayerful and financial support to please contact me directly to discuss these and other necessities.

I must also note that our School Principal, Sr. John Paul, O.P., our Parochial Vicar, Fr. Timothy Lynch, all of our Deacons, Katie Roden, our DRE, Joanne Middendorf, our Parish Business Administrator, other staff members, and many parish organizational leaders have been very instrumental in providing due vigilance on this matter, and I thank them for their work. Please pray for all of us in our ongoing efforts to make St. Michael Parish and School environments safe for all.

### THE MOUNT CARMEL ST. ANN'S WOMEN'S AUXILIARY COUNCIL



will host New York Times bestselling author Lisa Wingate on Thursday, November 1, 2018. Wingate's book, *Before We Were Yours*, is an historic fiction based on the stunning real-life story of the Tennessee Children's Home Society and its Memphis Branch Director, Georgia Tann. From the 1920s through 1950, thousands of children of single mothers and poverty-stricken parents were taken away. Sometimes even quietly whisked off front porches or from hospital maternity wards and placed for adoption to families who could afford to pay. ## ADORATION SCHEDULE:

**When can I visit?** The Chapel is open 24/7. The only exception is that The Blessed Sacrament will be reposed during Masses, including weekday Masses. During those times, the faithful are asked to attend Mass or make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle in church.

**How do I get in?** The Chapel is unlocked whenever the Parish Office is open (Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m.). For access outside of those hours, registration is required to obtain the access code to the front door and the Chapel door. This is for the safety of the Adorers in the Chapel.
