



## DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, THE RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE WILL BE FOCUSING ON THE IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY. THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH TEACHES US THAT:

**2208** – The family should live in such a way that its members learn to care and take responsibility for the young, the old, the sick, the handicapped, and the poor. There are many families who are at times incapable of providing this help. It devolves then on other persons, other families, and, in a subsidiary way, society to provide for their needs: "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

**2210** – The importance of the family for the life and well-being of society entails a particular responsibility for society to support and strengthen marriage and the family. Civil authority

should consider it a grave duty "to acknowledge the true nature of marriage and the family, to protect and foster them, to safeguard public morality, and promote domestic prosperity."


