OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH

During the month of November, the **Respect Life Committee will be focusing on** the importance of family. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that:

2205 - The Christian family is a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. In the procreation



partake of the prayer and sacrifice of Christ. Daily prayer and the reading of the Word of God strengthen it in charity. The Christian family has an evangelizing and missionary task.

The Catechism (2205) states that the Christian family has both an evangelizing and missionary task. How can your family fulfill this duty within the parish community? Within the community at large?

2207 – The family is the original cell of social life. It is the natural society in which husband and wife are called to give themselves in love and in the gift of life. Authority, stability, and a life of relationships within the family constitute the foundations for freedom, security, and fraternity within society. The family is the community in which, from childhood, one can learn moral values, begin to honor God, and make good use of freedom. Family life is an initiation into life in society.

On what occasions does your family pray and/or read scripture together? What are some ways to make this happen on a more regular basis?

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR HURRICANE RELIEF

There will be an emergency collection this weekend November 3rd-4th on behalf of those devastated by recent hurricanes, as well as any forthcoming natural disasters this year. Initially, funds will be used to support the efforts of Catholic Charities USA, as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in the form of water, food, shelter, and medical care, as well as to their long-term efforts to restore communities after widespread destruction. Humanitarian funds for any future disasters impacting communities outside the U.S. may be shared with Catholic Relief Services for their response efforts.



CATHOLICS CARE. CATHOLICS VOTE. PRACTICE CIVIL DIALOGUE.

In their statement on Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, the U.S. Catholic Bishops remind Catholics that we are called to engage in charitable, respectful and civil dialogue during election season. In a culture that is dominated by "partisan attacks, sound bites and media hype," the Church calls for "a different kind of political engagement." Visit www.faithfulcitizenship. org to access resources on civil dialogue and on how our faith calls us to engage during election season and beyond.

Ground Rules for Civil Dialogue

We are all called to engage in civil dialogue. Here are some possible ground rules for civil dialogue:

- 1. Make sure everyone has an opportunity to speak.
- 2. Share your personal experience, not someone else's.
- 3. Listen carefully and respectfully. Speak carefully and respectfully. Do not play the role of a know-it-all, convincer or corrector. Remember that a dialogue is not a debate.
- 4. Don't interrupt unless for clarification or time keeping.
- 5. Accept that no group or viewpoint has a complete monopoly on the truth to give a favorable interpretation to another's statement than condemn it (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2478, quoting St. Ignatius of Lovola).
- 7. Be cautious about assigning motives to another person.
