Dear Parishioners,

It is regrettable that circumstances have necessitated a change in our Adoration schedule. Currently, we cannot offer "Perpetual Adoration" as we would like due to a lack of scheduled adorers during many of our shifts. It has become increasingly harder on people to cover gaps in the schedule and, despite our best efforts, we are at the point of taking corrective measures. I thank all those who have been participants in this devotion and encourage you to continue to pray and invite others to join with you in praying before the Blessed Sacrament. For the current schedule, please consult the <u>Adoration Page</u> of our Parish Website.

Memorial of St. Blaise, February 3rd, falls on Sunday this year. Next weekend after the final blessing of Mass, the priests and deacons will be available for the annual Blessing of Throats. A person does not have to be Catholic to receive this blessing.

Monday, February 11th is the Memorial Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and is the World Day of the Sick, "a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's own suffering for the good of the Church, and of reminding us to see in our sick brother and sister the face of Christ who, by suffering, dying, and rising, achieved the salvation of the human race" (St. Pope John Paul II, Letter Instituting the World Day of the Sick, 13 May 1992, #3). On that day, as well as after the Sunday Masses on February 9th and 10th, the priests of the parish will be available for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and/or to pray for your health intentions. Those of the Catholic Faithful who are able to receive Holy Communion under normal circumstances and suffer from chronic physical ailments, those preparing for surgery, and the elderly may present themselves for the reception of the Sacrament of Anointing. If anyone does not wish to be anointed, but would like to have a priest pray over them, then they may do so by indicating their intention to the priest. A person does not have to be Catholic to have a priest pray over them.


