



#### **Respect Life Corner**

During the month of January, we remember the tragic decision of *Roe v. Wade*. Let us reflect on the following passage from the Catechism of the Catholic Church:

**1703** – Endowed with "a spiritual and immortal" soul,<sup>5</sup> the human person is "the only creature on earth that God has willed for its own sake."<sup>6</sup> From his conception, he is destined for eternal beatitude.

**1706** – By his reason, man recognizes the voice of God which urges him "to do what is good and avoid what is evil."<sup>9</sup> Everyone is obliged to follow this law, which makes itself heard in conscience and is fulfilled in the love of God and of neighbor. Living a moral life bears witness to the dignity of the person.

**1432** – The human heart is heavy and hardened. God must give man a new heart.<sup>25</sup> Conversion is first of all a work of the grace of God who makes our hearts return to him: "Restore us to thyself, O LORD, that we may be restored!"<sup>26</sup> God gives us the strength to begin anew. It is in discovering the greatness of God's love that our heart is shaken by the horror and weight of sin and begins to fear offending God by sin and being separated from him. The human heart is converted by looking upon him whom our sins have pierced:27


Let us fix our eyes on Christ's blood and understand how precious it is to his Father, for, poured out for our salvation it has brought to the whole world the grace of repentance.

*Roe v. Wade* has left a trail of broken hearts. Through Project Rachel and other ministries, we will continue to help the broken-hearted. Those who resort to abortion out of a sense of desperation often find the cruel reality of abortion too difficult to bear. But, it is too difficult only in a world without God and therefore without hope. We must reach these hearts and give them hope. 
Heading into 2019, we want to thank every parishioner who donated in any way to St. Vincent de Paul's numerous activities in 2018.

We are truly blessed to have so many generous parishioners. Below are some examples of how your generosity helped our community this past year:

- 1,795 people in 801 families received food through our pantry, because of your donations.
- Our Clothing Room helped 868 people in 207 families through your donations of clothes. In addition, 268 coats and over 500 hats and gloves were distributed to Sponsor-A-Family members. And, over 2,500 items were donated to the downtown St. Vincent de Paul Clothing Room.
- 1,300 gifts and 730 stocking stuffers were dropped off in the Giving Tree boxes this year. St. Michael School students contributed over 700 hats, gloves, scarves and socks. Gifts were distributed to the St. Frances Center in McArthur, OH, and Portsmouth, OH. And 100 filled stockings along with gifts were given to St. Lawrence Haven in Columbus to help support their Christmas Programs.
- 358 children in Worthington found gifts under their Christmas trees, because you sponsored a family through our Sponsor-A-Family Program.
- Your monetary contributions enabled us to buy cheese, bologna and bread to make 4,800 sandwiches to feed the homeless in Columbus.
- Toiletries and other needed items are purchased monthly with your monetary donations to help those in need at JOIN.
- 117 people in 51 families in our community have stayed warm and safe, because your monetary donations allowed us to assist them with rent, utility bills, furniture assistance or other needs.

Again, thank you St. Michael parishioners! Without your outstanding level of support, we could not effectively help those in need. Please keep us in your prayers so we have the strength to continue our work in 2019.

Each person then will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. Bimonthly Healing Masses take place at the Cathedral on the third Monday of the month. Secured parking is available off East Gay Street.
