PSR Information for Fall 2019-2020

Faith Formation Classes will be from 6:15 p.m.-7:30 p.m. on Mondays beginning on September 16th.

On the first Faith Formation Class of each month, we will be having a Family Catechesis night. The format of the night will be catechetical teaching on God's Plan of Salvation, with K-5th, 6-8th, and parent sessions teaching the same subjects at different levels. Then, all the families will gather together for prayer, worship, and Adoration.

The rest of the month, PSR for all grades will be held on Monday evenings from 6:15-7:30 p.m. These classes will be related to the teaching taught on Family Catechesis nights. All of the Faith Formation class will be learning the same content at age-appropriate levels with appropriate grade-level activities.

Please fill out registration as soon as possible which is online on our website (<u>www.saintmichael-cd.org</u>). The deadline for registration is September 1st. (Religious Ed is closed over the summer, but they will respond to your emails when they return starting August 15.)



For the summer, the Respect Life Corner will focus on the importance of marriage.

Let us reflect on the words of Pope Pius VIII in his encyclical Traditi Humilitati, "the sacrament of matrimony ought to be governed not so much by human law as by divine law and that it ought to be counted among sacred, not earthly, concerns.

Thus, it is wholly subject to the Church. Formerly marriage had no other purpose than that of bringing children into the world. But now it has been raised to the dignity of a

sacrament by Christ the Lord and enriched with heavenly gifts. Now its purpose is not so much to generate offspring as to educate children for God and for religion. This increases the number of worshipers of the true divinity.

It is agreed that the union of marriage signifies the perpetual and sublime union of Christ with His Church; as a result, the close union of husband and wife is a sacrament, that is, a sacred sign of the immortal love of Christ for His spouse."

BISHOP BRENNAN TO CELEBRATE BIMONTHLY MASS OF HEALING ON JULY 22, 6:30 P.M., SAINT JOSEPH CATHEDRAL

The Feast of Saint Mary Magdalene will be celebrated. Following the Mass, a Healing Service will begin with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Veneration of relics of the True Cross. Each person will then have an opportunity to speak individually with one of several priests present to discuss their particular situation and receive a prayer of healing. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will also be available. The Healing Service will conclude with Benediction. All persons who seek Christ's healing are invited – especially those who suffer with addictions, mental health issues, physical illness and infirmities (e.g., cancer and other debilitating diseases and conditions), in addition to those seeking emotional and spiritual healing.
