

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

Please note that the Distribution of Ashes will look a little different this year. During this time of pandemic, the Holy See has modified the method of distributing the ashes as the following:

The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.

These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient. The distribution of ashes via sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not well known here in the U.S. Deacons and Extraordinary Ministers may also assist with the Distribution of Ashes.

Ash Wednesday Masses this week will be at 6:30 a.m., 12:00 p.m., and 7:00 p.m. (Livestream).

ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday is February 17th. Public Masses will be held at 6:30am, 12noon, and 7:00pm (Livestreamed). Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence and fasting.

Abstinence – Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. The Law of Abstinence binds all those who have completed their 14th year of age and older. On those days these faithful are not to eat meat.

Fasting – Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting. The Law of Fasting binds all from the age of 18 through the end of the 59th year. The Law of Fasting prescribes that only one full meal a day be taken. Two lighter meals are permitted but combined should not be more than one full meal.



RESPECT LIFE CORNER

During the month of January, we remembered the tragic decision of Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion based on a woman's constitutional right to privacy. To better understand the teachings of the Catholic Church in regard to abortion, the Respect Life Corner will feature excerpts from Dignitas Personae. 4. In recent decades, medical science has made significant strides in understanding human life in its initial stages. Human biological structures and the process of human generation are better known. These developments are certainly positive and worthy of support when they serve to overcome or correct pathologies and succeed in re-establishing the normal functioning of human procreation. On the other hand, they are negative and cannot be utilized when they involve the destruction of human beings or when they employ means which contradict the dignity of the person or when they are used for purposes contrary to the integral good of man. The body of a human being, from the very first stages of its existence, can never be reduced merely to a group of cells. The embryonic human body develops progressively according to a well-defined program with its proper finality, as is apparent in the birth of every baby.

It is appropriate to recall the fundamental ethical criterion expressed in the Instruction Donum vitae in order to evaluate all moral questions which relate to procedures involving the human embryo: "Thus the fruit of human generation, from the first moment of its existence, that is to say, from the moment the zygote has formed, demands the unconditional respect that is morally due to the human being in his bodily and spiritual totality. The human being is to be respected and treated as a person from the moment of conception; and therefore from that same moment his rights as a person must be recognized, among which in the first place is the inviolable right of every innocent human being to life".[6]"


