DEAR PARISHIONERS,

There are few initiatives in the Diocese of Columbus that I want to draw your attention to. First, as has been already shared, is the 40 Days of Adoration. Adoration and Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be available at various parishes throughout the Diocese which will offer times for Mass, prayer, worship, the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We have been asked to host this at our parish on March 13th and will do so beginning at 8:00 a.m. with Mass and continuing until 8:00 p.m. A complete schedule is forthcoming. A letter from Fr. Adam Streitenberger, the Diocesan Coordinator for Evangelization, regarding the 40 Days of Adoration can be found at <https://columbuscatholic.org/local-news-3>.

Second, "Reconciliation Monday" is a request of Bishop Brennan, that priests of the Diocese are being asked to make confessions available at every parish on March 29th, the Monday of Holy Week, from 4:00 p.m.-7:00 p.m. Since we have, for the last several years, already offered confessions on that day from 7:00-9:00 p.m., Fr. Herge and I will now be available from 4:00-9:00 p.m. on that day.

Third, the Diocesan Planning Initiative, "Real Presence, Real Future," will be rolled out next weekend. Information will be shared in a variety of ways. We will get to hear a message from Bishop Brennan at the end of Masses. Information will also be made available through our Parish Website, Social Media and through our parish communication platform by "Flocknote." If you have not signed up for Flocknote, do so now to receive these messages. After signing up through our parish, you should also choose to join both the "From the Pastor" and "Weekly Notes and Updates" groups to receive notifications. If you need assistance in signing-up, please contact the parish office and ask for Anna Salmonowicz.

RESPECT LIFE CORNER

During the month of January we remember the tragic decision of Roe v. Wade, which legalized abortion based on a woman's constitutional right to privacy. To better understand the teachings of the Catholic Church in regard to abortion, the Respect Life Corner will feature excerpts from Dignitas Personae.

"5. This ethical principle, which reason is capable of recognizing as true and in conformity with the natural moral law, should be the basis for all legislation in this area.[7] In fact, it presupposes a truth of an ontological character, as Donum vitae demonstrated from solid scientific evidence, regarding the continuity in development of a human being.

If Donum vitae, in order to avoid a statement of an explicitly philosophical nature, did not define the embryo as a person, it nonetheless did indicate that there is an intrinsic connection between the ontological dimension and the specific value of every human life. Although the presence of the spiritual soul cannot be observed experimentally, the conclusions of science regarding the human embryo give "a valuable indication for discerning by the use of reason a personal presence at the moment of the first appearance of a human life: how could a human individual not be a human person?". [8] Indeed, the reality of the human being for the entire span of life, both before and after birth, does not allow us to posit either a change in nature or a gradation in moral value, since it possesses full anthropological and ethical status. The human embryo has, therefore, from the very beginning, the dignity proper to a person.

AROUND THE PARISH

THANK YOU FROM THE ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

We want to thank every parishioner who donated in any way to St. Vincent De Paul's numerous activities in 2020.

We are truly blessed to have so many generous parishioners who continued to support us through this exceedingly difficult year. Below are some examples of how your generosity helped our community:

Our food pantry has been able to continue to operate in a limited fashion, and 891 people in 172 families received food through our pantry because of your donations.

- Over 1,000 gifts were dropped off in the Giving Tree boxes this year. Gifts were distributed to the St Frances Center in McArthur, OH, and St. Lawrence Haven.
- 218 children in Worthington found gifts under their Christmas trees because you sponsored a family through our Sponsor-A-Family program. And 79 families each received a box of food donated by you through our Fill a Bag drive.
- Your monetary contributions enabled us to buy cheese, ham, and bread to make 4,800 sandwiches to feed the homeless in Columbus.
- 41 families in our community have stayed warm and safe because your monetary donations allowed us to assist them with rent, utility bills, furniture assistance or other needs.
- Our clothing room has not been able to operate during the pandemic. Until we can re-open, we ask that you take your donations to the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store at 5969 E Main Street in Reynoldsburg, or to the Salvation Army.

Again, thank you St. Michael parishioners! Without your outstanding level of support, we could not effectively help those in need. Please keep us in your prayers so we have the strength to continue our work in 2021.

75TH ANNIVERSARY "DID YOU KNOW" – THE BUILDINGS:

School Addition:

- February 15, 1981 Campaign kickoff drive for new school addition to replace classrooms housed in deteriorating Quonset hut.
- June 7, 1981 Groundbreaking began. Original cost of the building was \$476,850.
- February 28, 1962 Dedication/Open House by an enthusiastic crowd that was present, including founding pastor Father John Byrne. In the 1997-1999 addition of Marian Hall, construction also included a library, school administrative office, an art room and computer lab were added to the west end of the school, and a band room, music room, athletic storage, storage garages, and a collection room for St. Vincent DePaul Society was added to the Gym (East) wing. Additional parking (45 spaces) was also added to the east end of the Gym wing.



Marian Hall:

- July 1997 Construction began through May 1999. Cost of the building construction was \$3,500,00. Construction added a gathering space between the rectory and church and meeting rooms in the lower level. Location in color aerial photo: Center left of church

Parish Ministry Center:

- November 30, 2013: Blessing by Bishop Frederick Campbell. The parish ministry center included new parish offices, additional meeting rooms, an adoration chapel, pre-K room, a food pantry and clothing room. Location in color aerial photo: Left front

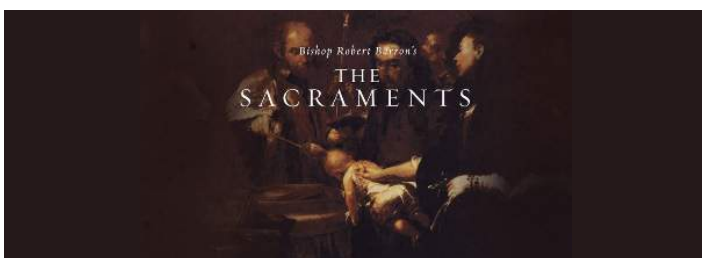
40 Days of Adoration
