St. Michael Parish Results

Your Feedback on the DMI Survey Provides Valuable Information for St. Michael Parish



This past spring our parish had the opportunity to participate in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey. About 33 percent of parishioners took the opportunity to give their feedback. The national participation average is between 7-10 percent, so this puts St. Michael above the national average.

The Disciple Maker Index contained 75 questions designed to provide an opportunity for parishioners to reflect on their individual spiritual growth and overall parish effectiveness. Almost 300,000 Catholics from more than 1,500 parishes throughout 40 dioceses have taken the DMI since 2013, providing not just valuable data for each parish, but for the Church nationally as well.

Of the 336 surveys that were completed, 318 were done online and 18 completed on paper at the parish. The majority of respondents were women, representing 60 percent of the total respondents.





Key Findings

St. Michael Strengths

Attitudes and Beliefs

- 79% strongly believe in the True Presence of the Eucharist, compared to 71% nationally and 74% in our diocese.
- 80% strongly believe that Scripture is the Word of God, compared to 69% nationally and 73% in our diocese.
- 85% attend Mass at least weekly and 70% pray daily.

Potential Action Step: Identify which of these strengths align with the following opportunities for growth and could be a starting point for future efforts.

St. Michael Opportunities for Growth

Sharing the faith with others

- Our lowest 3 rankings were:
 1. Sharing personal story
 2. Sharing the story of Jesus
 3. Explaining Church teachings
- 46% never invite someone to come to Mass, compared to 33% nationally and 38% in our diocese.

Potential Action Step: Identify the role of a personal witness story and plan how to explain and train for discipleship.

Helping Spiritual Growth of Parishioners

- 27% strongly agree that the parish helps their spiritual growth, compared to 38% nationally and 35% in our diocese.
- Our least frequent spiritual practices were:
 1. Spiritual direction / pastoral counseling
 2. Attending a retreat

Potential Action Step: Plan ways to encourage faith mentor relationships, retreat attendance & catechesis opportunities.

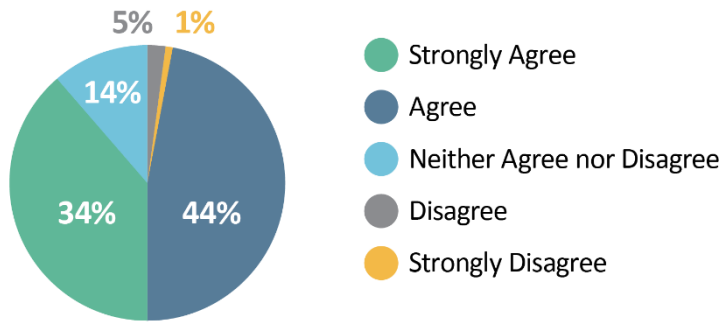

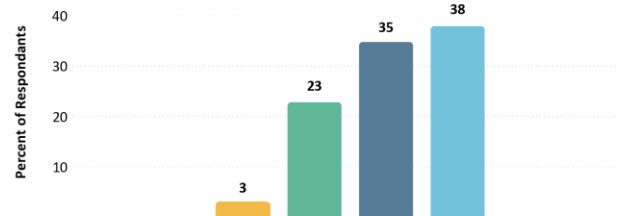

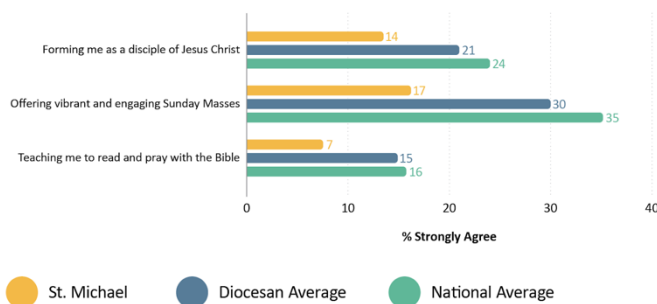


Personal Faith Life
