

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

We are now into our fifth week of the Bishop's Annual Appeal. So far, we have received \$111,172.00 in pledges toward our goal of \$127,524.00. With just \$16,352.00 to go until we meet our goal, we have great hope that we will be able to exceed that goal. Your generosity is outstanding. Please support this effort as it does provide for a wide variety of services for the 23-county area of our diocese. These services are vital for many as they struggle day to day to make ends meet. If you have not yet made your pledge, there is still time to do so. Anything that is over our goal comes back to us for our own use. Please prayerfully consider a sacrificial gift toward this worthwhile endeavor! God bless you!

As has been announced, our Parochial Vicar Fr. Herge has been appointed pastor of the Jackson-Vinton County Consortium of Parishes and will begin there on July 13th. While I have received no official word as to whether we will be receiving a priest in his stead, I feel that has been prudent to make plans accordingly. I have some ideas already being investigated and will be doing some further consulting before those ideas are developed and announced. In the case that changes are to be made with Mass schedule, we will continue for a time with what we have been doing. It will not make sense for us to move things back for weekday Masses, only to change them again if the next month or so. I will communicate to the parish when those decisions are completed and take effect.

Regarding a farewell for Fr. Herge, after discussing this with him, we are going to simply opt to provide an opportunity after each Mass on the weekend of July 10-11 for parishioners to offer their gratitude and to send him off with our prayers. A gift table will be set up for anyone who would like to offer him a parting gift.


75TH ANNIVERSARY "DID YOU KNOW"

The Baptistry was painted in January 2007 by a local artist who attended the 6:30 a.m. weekday Mass and the expense was borne by the donation of a parishioner family. Did you know our baptistery is octagonal? Do you know the significance of "8"? The



Jewish Sabbath, Saturday, is the seventh and last day of their week. Jesus' Resurrection took place on a Sunday. Its significance cannot be exaggerated. With the Resurrection comes a new life, recreation, the conquest of sin and death. These are the same realities that occur at every Baptism. Sunday for the Jewish faith is the first day of the week. For Christians, it is the "8th" day because it signifies a new creation, a new beginning, and a new life that happened the day after the Jewish Sabbath or 7th day. That is why our baptistery has eight sides.

REAL PRESENCE, REAL FUTURE REFLECTIONS: BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST – IT IS REALLY JESUS

"While they were eating he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, 'Take it; this is my body.'" At that meal with His disciples, Jesus gave us the source and summit of our faith, the Eucharist. He is truly present in the Eucharist, as He promised. This Real Presence of Jesus brings us as close to Him as we can be while on this earth. We must explain and share this gift of our faith in order to have a Real Future and so that everyone can share in this joy every time we receive the Eucharist.

SOCIETY OF THE DIVINE SAVIOR (SALVATORIANS)

The Salvatorians were founded by Fr. Francis Jordan, a German priest, on December 8th, 1881. He had been ordained in July, 1878. At this time the move to separate State from Church had developed into a harsh restriction of the ministry and pastoral care activities of the Church in Germany. The Kulturkampf Laws were introduced to try and limit the power and influence of the Church in Germany, but Fr. Jordan wanted to establish a religious society that would work to mitigate the effects of these oppressive legal provisions. He developed an ambitious plan to grow a society that would have three degrees of membership, the first being that of the members who would be professed and who would maintain the three evangelical counsels, usually referred to as the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience.

- **Mission** The Society of the Divine Savior (Salvatorians) proclaims and teaches by all ways and means the goodness and kindness of Jesus the Savior.
- **Vision** Salvatorians seek to become apostles for our times in order to make the Savior known to all people
- Apostolate We are called to be apostles for the renewal of the Church and the world, and we invite
 others to discover and respond to their call to be apostles. We advocate for justice and peace, standing
 with the poor and marginalized. We are servant-leaders, involving others in our mission. We support one
 another through mutual love and service. We live a simple lifestyle, becoming one with those we serve,
 especially the poor.
- **Universality** We include as members of the Society people from every nation, and we are open to serve the people of any nation.

The Focus for this Missions Appeals: My focus is to serve our missions in Tanzania. Salvatorians have served in Tanzania for over 60 years. Today, we Salvatorians are serving in parishes, schools, dispensaries for kids, Catholic radio programs for evangelization and inter-religious dialogue, youth awareness ministries, farms, drinking water projects, and in the formation of priests and lay ministers. We mostly serve in the dioceses of Morogoro, Dodoma, Dar es Salaam and Tunduru-Masasi where we have a big Islamic population.

The funds we earn from the missionary cooperative plan will help us sustain our missions and missionaries and train seminarians for the future leaders of the Church, thus allow them to continue their important work of making the Savior known.
