### **Christmas Mass Times**

Christmas falls on a Saturday this year and is a Holy Day of Obligation. (The last time this happened was in 2010). Please note the following Mass schedule:

December 24<sup>th</sup> (Christmas Eve): Masses are at 4:00pm, 6:00pm and Midnight

December 25<sup>th</sup> (Christmas Day): Masses are at 9:00am and 11:00am\*

**\*Please note that because Christmas falls on a Saturday, there will not be a 4:00pm Mass on Saturday Evening. Sunday December 26<sup>th</sup>, (The Feast of the Holy Family)**

**is still a Sunday Obligation Day as usual, but the only Masses will be at 8:30am, 10:30am and 12:30pm on Sunday. There is no Saturday Evening Vigil for this Mass.**

For the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God, while not a Holy Day of Obligation this year, we will have the following Masses for those who would like to attend.

December 31<sup>st</sup>: at 7:00pm and January 1<sup>st</sup> at 8:15am.

**Are you being Spoofed?**

What is spoofing? On a phone “Spoofing is when a caller deliberately falsifies the information transmitted to your caller ID display to disguise their identity. Scammers often use neighbor spoofing so it appears that an incoming call is coming from a local number, or spoof a number from a company or a government agency that you may already know and trust. If you answer, they use scam scripts to try to steal your money or valuable personal information, which can be used in fraudulent activity” ( <https://www.fcc.gov/spoofing>). Spoofing can also occur with email and text messages. A recent occurrence which was brought our attention is one in which a person received a phone call from what appeared to be St. Michael Church. The caller ID not only listed the name of St. Michael Parish, but even the legitimate phone number of St. Michael’s Parish office on the display. Fortunately, the person who received the calls, did not respond, but did notify us that they had received several calls from what appeared to be our parish number, yet no one had made the calls. So please be extra cautious. Always double check to verify any calls you may receive.
