

## MARCH 6, 2022 THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

"I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given to me." (DEUTERONOMY 26:10)

This line from the Old Testament offers two challenges. First, do you give to God from your "first fruits" - the first and best that you have to

offer, or do you give from what you have leftover? Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

## FROM THE PASTOR

### DEAR PARISHIONERS.

Here are some important updates for you.

<u>Masks in Church</u>: Yesterday we received a message from Msgr. Stephan Moloney, our Diocesan Administrator, regarding an update on the wearing of masks in Churches of the Diocese of Columbus. The following has now gone into effect:

- Parishioners are no longer requested to wear masks.
- Those who feel safer may continue to wear masks and should be respected for their choice.
- Parishioners who are ill, have significant health risk factors, or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting COVID-19 in a large group of persons, continue to be excused from the obligation to attend Mass.
- While not mandatory, clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion may still wear masks during the distribution of Communion.
- The distribution of the Precious Blood to the congregation remains prohibited until further notice.
- Parishioners should stay connected to information coming from medical and other experts, and to stay home and get tested for COVID-19 when experiencing COVID like symptoms.

Lenten Parish Mission: We will be hosting a Lenten Parish Mission 3 nights this month. Featuring Andrew Petiprin and Joe Zambon, both fellows at the Word on Fire Institute (part of Bishop Robert Barron's Word on Fire Catholic Ministries). They will present talks (Andrew) and lead us in music/worship (Joe) each night beginning at 6:45pm on March 28th, 29th and 30th. Topics for each evening will be: (Monday) Is God Real?, (Tuesday) Who is Jesus Christ?, and (Wednesday) Why the Church? Also, there will be time set aside for Eucharistic Adoration on Monday evening, a Penance Service on Tuesday, and a concluding Mass on Wednesday. More information will be forthcoming in the bulletin and on our parish website. We hope to see everyone there! Also be sure to check out the bulletin and website for other Lenten activities.

**Special Collection for Ukraine:** Parishes in the Diocese of Columbus have been asked to take up a special collection for Catholic Relief Services to provide assistance to families affected in Ukraine. This will done diocesan-wide the weekend of March 12/13. There will a second collection that will be taken up after Communion at Masses here that weekend. Please make checks payable to St. Michael Parish and write Ukraine Relief on the memo line. Funds collected will be forwarded to Catholic Relief Services through normal diocesan channels. ## WOMEN'S FAITH AND FELLOWSHIP WELLNESS TALK: "HOLY & WHOLE"




## WOMEN'S FAITH AND FELLOWSHIP LENTEN SERVICE PROJECT

## FASTING:

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting. The Law of Fasting binds all from the age of 18 through the end of the 59th year. The Law of Fasting prescribes that only one full meal a day be taken. Two lighter meals are permitted but combined should not be more than one full meal.

## ABSTINENCE:

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence. The Law of Abstinence binds all those who have completed their 14th year of age and older. On those days these faithful are not to eat meat.





## SYNODAL PROCESS MEETINGS



## Question 1:

The Synodal process invites each one of us - the People of God to recall that we journey together. Moreover, in that journey of faith, we are called to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit.

- As you listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit, what have been the joys and obstacles in your journeying together with the church?
- Please share a brief story that illustrates your experience.

## **Question 2:**

"Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice." (Preparatory Document no. 30) and "All are invited to speak with courage and parrhesia, that is, in freedom, truth, and charity." (Preparatory Document no. 30).

- How have you experienced the Church reaching out to those who are on the peripheries and marginalized, including cultural groups, women, the disabled, those who experience poverty, marginalization, or social exclusion?
- What enables or hinders you from speaking up courageously, candidly, and responsibly in your parish and society?

## **Question 3:**

"Synodality is at the service of the mission of the Church, in which all members are called to participate. A Synodal church is a participatory and co-responsible Church." (Preparatory Document no. 30).

- How do we promote participation in decision-making within hierarchically structured communities?
- What hinders people from being active in your parish?
- How is authority or governance exercised in your local parish?


## **AROUND THE DIOCESE**

#### NORTH HIGH DEANERY - WHAT IS A SYNOD?

Like many of the words that we use in our Catholic tradition, Synod is an ancient Greek word meaning assembling to determine the path forward. A Synod is a process that gathers Christ's disciples so that their voices can be heard. It is the Church's belief that each and everyone's voice is that of Christ, and when two or three of Christ's Faithful are gathered, He is present and alive in their midst. The history of the Church also shows us that the model of Synodality was a critical tool at times of crisis and challenge. The model of a Synod allows the presence of Christ to be given voice at this moment in our history. Responding to Pope Francis' call for all to participate in his Synod on Synodality, our Deanery will conduct a synodal listening session at the Marian Hall of Immaculate Conception Church, 414 East North Broadway, Columbus, on Saturday, March 12, 1:00-3:00 p.m. This session will provide an opportunity to share our thoughts and feelings but more importantly to discern how the Holy Spirit is guiding us in our journey together. Growing up in a country where the main religion is 95% Muslim, Lucienne grew strong in her Christian faith - learning from both her Grandmother and her Mother. Lucienne had dreams of gaining an education in France but God had different plans for her. Lucienne listened and ended up coming to the United States in 1997 alone and with no family or friends - earning her M.B.A. and eventually becoming a US citizen. Throughout her journey, she has experienced racism, times of darkness, and loneliness but it was always her trust that shone and quided her. Lucienne will share her ministry of S.A.L.T. - as she takes us on her journey from The Gambia where her father sold raw salt for a living - carrying it on his head to take it to market miles away - to growing up in a culture where domestic violence is accepted, to immigrating to a new country by herself, then finally "making a deal" with God, to bring the ministry of the Sacred Heart to The Gambia. Lucienne has lived what the Gospel of Matthew describes as " we must be both salt and light..." and Pope Francis says "...salt must add flavor and light must illuminate..." 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
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
