

# JULY 23, 2023, SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN **ORDINARY TIME**

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field...He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom."

- Matthew 13:24, 37-38

As children of God, we are all "good

seeds". We are blessed by God with the potential to accomplish much good in the world. We fulfill God's plan when we spend time in prayer every day, use our skills to help others and share our financial gifts to help build God's kingdom on earth. Through our example of gratitude and generosity we sow "good seeds" on earth and ultimately help each other get to Heaven!

## FROM THE PASTOR...

ON THIS SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Jesus teaches us an overarching theme in the parables that He uses. Jesus describes that we, although very small in number, are meant to go out into the world and, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the help of God's grace, transform it into the kingdom of God. Take a look at the small segment of today's Gospel parable concerning "yeast" in the broader Gospel of the weeds among wheat. Jesus chose twelve simple fishermen, tax-collectors and other so-called "nobodies" in the eyes of the world, and they were the yeast that brought the faith into the entire known world at the time. To give you a comparison of what this would be like today, it would be as if Jesus went somewhere into our Diocese of Columbus (roughly the size of ancient Palestine) and chose 12 ordinary people and told them to go out into the whole world and proclaim the Good News of salvation through Jesus Christ - and they succeeded! Jesus uses the image of yeast to describe His true disciple's mission in the world; because just as it doesn't take much yeast to leaven a whole loaf, so one disciple of Christ - or a few - can effect immeasurable good in the world. Take a look, for example, at what God was able to do in most of our lifetimes through the life of the young Albanian farm girl, Agnes Bojaxhiu, better known to us as Mother Teresa (Saint Teresa of Calcutta). Starting on one street corner in Calcutta, caring one at a time for her brothers and sisters in Christ dying in the streets without even the dignity of a deathbed, she was able to bring God's love and face throughout the entire world. Imagine what would happen if each one of us were to take our faith as seriously as Mother Teresa did hers, as the 12 apostles did theirs. When it comes right down to it, in many ways, we're much more gifted than they were, better educated, with many more material resources than they ever had. What distinguished them from others is a choice they made - a choice that we, too, are completely capable of making, the choice to say "yes!" wholeheartedly to God, to say "yes!" to His plan for us, to say "yes!" to Him in each moment of the day, and to follow through. To say "yes!" and be the yeast at home, at the places where we work, at our various schools, on the athletic field, at the grocery store, in restaurants, on social media, bringing Jesus to others everywhere! When others might be tempted to hate, we can love. When others lie, we can tell the truth. When others might be tempted to seek revenge, we can forgive. When others might see in other people means to their end, we can see children of God whom God loved enough to die for. When others might sow dissension, we can sow peace. When others might bring despair or cynicism, we can sow hope. And when others sow seeds of materialism or atheism, we could bring the faith, hope and love of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. This, folks, is the yeast that Jesus Christ is calling us to be. There are more than one billion Catholics in the world today; there are over 340,000 here in the Diocese of Columbus. In our parish, there are approximately 2,000 Catholic families, and right now during this Sunday Mass there are several hundred in our parish church of Saint Michael. Now, imagine what would happen in this neighborhood, in Worthington, in Columbus and throughout Central Ohio, in our Diocese, in the United States and the world, if each and every one of us took our faith as seriously as Jesus' first disciples and became yeast in our own surroundings, and within the various groups of people with whom we work and interact with. Imagine what would happen in our families, in our schools and in our society. FOLKS, IT CAN HAPPEN, SO LET'S MAKE IT HAPPEN! Such a call to be the yeast of the world is not just for priests and religious, but as the Second Vatican Council clearly teaches, for every one of the baptized. May God bless each and every one of us and strengthen us for such a vocation as disciples of Christ!

**TODAY IS THE THIRD WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND ELDERLY** and so we give our honor, thanks, and prayer to all grandparents and elderly in our families and our parish family. The theme – "His mercy is from age to age" (Luke 1:50) – was chosen to be in tune with that of World Youth Day in Lisbon: Mary arose and went with haste, taken from Luke's Gospel. Even the short passage, "His mercy from age to age" is taken from Luke's Gospel and is the end of the first part of the Magnificat, when Mary immediately goes to meet her elderly cousin, Elizabeth, after the Angel's annunciation. Thus, it is a theme that highlights the importance of dialogue between generations, which is fundamental for perceiving and contemplating God's merciful action on behalf of human beings. Indeed, dialogue between the elderly and the young and people of all ages helps to obtain a more complete vision of the way in which a more humane and fraternal society can be built.



#### PLEASE HELP THE SERRA CLUB PROMOTE VOCATIONS!




