FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners of St. Michael,
Praised be Jesus Christ!

I pray you are enjoying the season of Summer!

We, as usual, have several important events taking place in the coming days.

-We will soon be welcoming our visiting Missionary Priest for our annual Missionary Co-op Program. Fr. Anthony Benedict will be joining us next weekend to preach about the good works taking place in his diocese in India.

A letter from Father will be included in our bulletin so we can read about his diocese and know more about how our support will sustain the Church in its missionary fields.

-We will also be entering into our TOTUS TUUS week wherein we will welcome a team of missionary catechists who will run a camp for our parish children this week. We are at about 100 children, which is a great blessing! Please pray for our children as they participate in this week of formation in our holy faith. Please pray for the missionaries who will pour themselves out for the benefit of our children! It is really exciting to welcome this experience to our parish family.

-Next weekend, we will host a band of traveling missionaries of sorts after the 8:30 a.m. Mass. They are biking across the country in support of Pro-life efforts. They will have a booth after the 8:30 a.m. Mass before they hit the road to continue their journey across the USA.

-I wish to extend an invitation to all of our parishioners who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation and wish to learn more about the faith so as to potentially serve as a Catechist. Our parish receives many requests for what amounts to be "tutoring in the faith" so that individuals can prepare for reception of sacraments or enter into the Church. Simply put, we don't have in place anything to allow for people to grow in their desire to enter into union with Jesus and His Church that is flexible and suited to particular needs of individuals and families.

The Confraternity of Christian Doctrine will be a community of disciples from within our parish who will strive to study the faith and then serve the Lord by instructing others in the faith. For some Catechists, they will lead classes of junior high students, for other Catechists, they may give instruction and witness to a family seeking preparation for the Sacraments. We are in need of Catechists to instruct those who are homebound or are in nursing and care facilities. You may be someone simply looking for opportunities to learn the faith so you can more properly give witness and instruction to others at home.

LASTLY... Just as a teaser of sorts, October will be our second Adoration Campaign. I'm inviting each household to begin considering which hour of Adoration you would like to commit to for the next year. This period of time leading up to October is the perfect time to think about switching hours or even days. This is also a great time to begin inviting someone to join you for your hour of Adoration and then encourage them to take one of their own during the Adoration Campaign.

Our goal for this year's Adoration Campaign is to not only EXPAND EXPOSITION to be PERPETUAL but to also add second Adorers to each hour, especially the nighttime hours.

If each household would commit to one hour of Adoration of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist, we would have an incredibly enhanced POWERHOUSE OF PRAYER! If each Adorer invited one person to come and adore we would have double the amount of people praying before the Lord Jesus and giving Him proper worship and honor.

Do This in Remembrance of Me; Part 72: How to Receive

You may have noticed that people receive Communion in different ways. Is there a right way? *How exactly should we receive Holy Communion?* First of all, it is important to notice that we receive Communion. Holy Communion is our greatest gift, a gift to be received through the generous love of Jesus. Holy Communion should never be taken by our own action. As The General Instruction of the Roman Missal states, "It is not permitted for the faithful to take the consecrated Bread or the sacred chalice by themselves and, still less, to hand them on from one to another among themselves. The norm established for the Dioceses of the United States of America is that Holy Communion is to be received standing, unless an individual member of the faithful wishes to receive Communion while kneeling" (GIRM, 160). Adjustments are possible for those unable to stand or kneel. Many churches have areas where Communion is brought directly to the pew for those who find walking to receive Communion difficult. The instruction makes clear that we are receiving the gift of Holy Communion and not taking this gift for ourselves, a truth we emphasize in the posture we observe as we receive the Sacred Host. For those receiving in the hand, we hold our hands steady with an open palm throne to receive Our Lord truly present. For those receiving on the tongue, we are still as we wait for the placement of the Sacred Host on the tongue.

Why Do We Bow before Receiving Communion?

I often see people bowing before approaching the minister. Should I do that also? Yes! As the GIRM continues, "When receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister... When Holy Communion is received under both kinds, the sign of reverence is also made before receiving the Precious Blood" (GIRM, 160). As I have often shared when teaching children about postures of prayer and reverence, our sign of reverence actually provides an opportunity for our bodies to help remind our minds and hearts who we believe is before us. We believe that Jesus, Almighty God, Second Person of the Trinity, is there before us in the Holy Eucharist. Our bow helps us recall that he really is there and that we believe he really is there! Like so many parts of our lives that are repeated regularly, we may risk just going through the motions at this part of the Mass. However, if we do that, we would be overlooking Jesus truly there before us! The next time you are approaching Holy Communion, take the challenge of really bowing with reverence and recall Jesus is there. Perhaps pray to yourself those words of St. Thomas: "My Lord and My God" (John 20:28). Along these lines, the Diocese of Peoria says, "Even the procession toward Communion is a great ritual act, as we humbly approach the Lord Jesus. The Bishops of the United States have asked that we make a bow as a sign of reverence toward the Eucharist before receiving... It is an encounter as we receive him—Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity!" (A Study of the Mass, pp. 19–20).

Practical Tips for Receiving Communion

How about some practical tips? Absolutely! As I mentioned above, one great way of being in the mode of "receiving" is to stay still as the minister brings the Host to you. As a practical note, I have often noticed that some people will lunge forward toward the Sacred Host, or at times those intending to receive on the tongue will even bite the host or lick upward. For those receiving in the hand, I have noticed that sometimes people will already be closing their hand before the Host is placed there. I presume these might be ways of trying to help the minister; however, it truly is easiest and perhaps the most prayerful if you remain still until Jesus in the Sacred Host comes to you.

For those receiving in the hand, Fr. Oury notes that St. Cyril offers instruction: "When you approach, do not come with palms of the hand spread flat, nor with fingers wide apart... [M]ake him a throne with your left [hand]. In the hollow of your hand receive the Body of Christ and answer: Amen... [C]onsume [The Host] and be careful that none of it be lost... Tell me, if you were given some grains of gold, would you not guard them with the greatest care so as not to lose any one of them and be the poorer? Should you not be even more careful not to let drop the least particle of what is more precious than gold or precious stones?" (The Mass, pp. 121–2; Mystagogical Catechesis 5, 21). St. Cyril reminds us to have a worthy reception of the King of Kings, certainly both in receiving him well and also in honoring his presence in even the smallest fragments. St. Cyril invites us to examine our hands and fingers for any particles of the Eucharist after we have received Our Lord.

One last practical tip might be to think about what you are saying when you say, "Amen." I encourage you to make it a vigorous Amen, reminding yourself that word means, "Jesus, I believe you are really here." This Amen is an important prayer of faith at the moment of receiving Holy Communion. Charles Belmonte reflects further on the Amen: "Yes, Lord, I believe. I love and I hope in you. I know my time of waiting is over, for my hope is now made into a reality which fulfills the deepest needs of my faith and my charity. You are mine, and I am yours... My soul worships you in stillness" (Understanding the Mass, p. 187). Let us make this beautiful prayer of faith our own, the next time and every time we say Amen and receive the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus!

For Reflection:

1. Meditate on the humility of Jesus which Paul describes in his [Letter to the Philippians 2:5–10](#). Keep this passage in mind when you approach the Eucharist and bow in reverence. Alternatively, pray with other passages of the Scriptures which invite us to bow before the Lord (e.g., [Psalm 5:7](#); [Psalm 138:2](#); [Matthew 8:2](#)).
2. [Revelation 3:14](#) describes Jesus as "[t]he Amen, the faithful and true witness." Pray with Jesus as the "Amen" and ask for the grace to unite your "Amen" in receiving Communion to his "Amen" to the Father's will.





Do This in Remembrance of Me, Part 73: Communion under Both Forms

Last time, we addressed making a sign of reverence before receiving Communion in the sacred host or in the chalice. This time, we consider receiving from the chalice in particular. You may have noticed differences in what churches do for Communion. Someone who travels might encounter parishes where the Precious Blood is offered and others where everyone receives the sacred host without receiving from the chalice.

Let's look at The General Instruction of the Roman Missal: "It is most desirable that the faithful, just as the Priest himself is bound to do, receive the Lord's Body from hosts consecrated at the same Mass and that, in the cases where this is foreseen, they partake of the chalice, so that even by means of the signs Communion may stand out more clearly as a participation in the sacrifice actually being celebrated" (GIRM, 85). The point here is to emphasize that receiving Communion itself should help unite us to the Holy Sacrifice—through hosts consecrated at the Mass and, (then notice) "where this is foreseen," from the chalice.

When Do We Receive Communion from the Chalice?

So, when are members of the faithful able to receive from the chalice? The GIRM reminds us that the bishops have the authority to give guidelines for the manner of receiving Communion in their dioceses. This is because the bishops are the caretakers of the liturgy within their dioceses. The GIRM does provide some guidelines for the bishops to follow: "Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds. For in this form the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more clearly evident and clearer expression is given to the divine will by which the new and eternal Covenant is ratified in the Blood of the Lord, as also the connection between the Eucharistic banquet and the eschatological banquet in the Kingdom of the Father" (GIRM, 281). What is this paragraph saying with "both kinds" (or sometimes we see the description "both forms")? The reference here is to Communion being offered under the form of the sacred host and in the chalice. That is, that Communion would be offered in forms that involve both eating and drinking.

Why Don't We Always Receive from the Chalice?

So, why don't we always have Communion under both forms? Believe it or not, one simple reason is practicality. Having numerous people drink from the chalice requires either a very large chalice or a number of chalices. Depending on the size of the parish, this could be no problem; but in parishes that are very large, this can become a challenge. In one parish where I visited, there were 10 to 20 extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion at every Mass. As you might imagine, getting all these folks prepared and to their stations was quite a process. Another practical reason for some bishops and pastors is concern for reverence and the worry over potentially spilling the Precious Blood. Additionally, with heightened sensitivity to health, for some, the sharing of the chalice is personally challenging.

Along with some of these practical reasons, there is also a faith consideration based on our belief that Jesus is really and completely present under either form of Communion. The GIRM states, "Sacred pastors should take care to ensure that the faithful... are made aware by the most suitable means possible of the Catholic teaching on the form of Holy Communion as laid down by the Ecumenical Council of Trent. Above all, they should instruct the Christian faithful that the Catholic faith teaches that Christ, whole and entire, and the true Sacrament, is received even under only one species, and hence that as regards the resulting fruits, those who receive under only one species are not deprived of any grace that is necessary for salvation" (GIRM, 282). This text reminds pastors to make sure people know that receiving the host is receiving the whole Christ; receiving from the chalice is receiving the whole Christ; receiving both forms is receiving the whole Christ. There have been times in history where this teaching was not necessarily clear; for some, receiving Communion under one form can assist with that clarity.

Who Decides When We Receive from the Chalice?

Ultimately, the decision is up to the bishop, who can choose to extend the decision to the individual pastor. Bishops are charged to do whatever they think will be most helpful to people spiritually, while at the same time guarding the true faith and reverence for Jesus present in the Holy Sacrament. So, when you travel and notice that some parishes have Communion under both forms and some do not, know that the bishop and pastor have decided, according to the instruction of the GIRM, to do what they think is best for their parishes and people at the present time. As always, if we don't understand the wisdom of our leaders in these decisions, we are invited to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance and wisdom, and continue to pray for true unity in Christ!

For Reflection:

1. Pray with [1 Corinthians 10:14–22](#), where St. Paul describes our unity in the "one loaf" of the Eucharist. Ask for a greater appreciation of Communion as union with Christ and one another.
2. Make a commitment to pray daily for your local bishop and for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all his decisions.
